# **STEWARDSHIP**

# Anyway?

Stewardship is often one of those words we hear in Church that we're not always sure exactly what it means.

Simply put, stewardship is taking care of something that has been entrusted to you.

As you might have guessed, stewardship is also a significant part of living a Christian life. Before we get past the first chapter in Genesis, God names humanity as the stewards (or caretakers) of all of creation—of the birds in the air, the fish in the seas, and the beasts of the fields.

Building on the idea that God created <u>everything</u> and subsequently handed it over to us for taking care of, as Christians we also recognize that <u>everything</u> belongs to God—even all the things we think we own. They all actually belong to God, not us. Even <u>our own lives</u> are not ours, as we are told in 1 Corinthians 6:19-20.

Since everything is God's, and we're just managing things on God's behalf, that means our lives are ones of stewardship--taking care of what God has given us and using it in a way that glorifies God.

Jesus discusses the serious nature of good stewardship in his parable of the talents. You might recall, three servants are each given a number of talents (money) by their master: one servant received ten, another five, and another one. The master leaves these talents in the capable hands of his servants and departs. When he returns, he is pleased with the first servant who used the ten talents he was given to steward to gain ten more. The servant who had five did likewise and gained five more. But the servant with only one talent was fearful of losing it, causing the master to be angry, so he hid it in the ground and did nothing with it. This servant was harshly reprimanded for being foolish and not using what had been entrusted to him for the benefit of the master.

In the same way, we are called to <u>intentionally</u> and <u>intelligently</u> steward all that God has given to us. This is true in our individual lives and in the life of our congregation. <u>How are you using what God has given to you to bring glory to God? How are we as LMC using all we have been given to serve Christ and others?</u>



This is an act demonstrating strong individual stewardship--committing ourselves and our families to Christ's mission. It is also a great of communal stewardship act as the information we receive from these cards will enable us to draft a more accurate budget for 2024, making us better able to maximize our ministry from all we gather.

Stewardship isn't just about money. It is about taking care of all that God has given to us. One of these things is God's beautiful and historic church building which we are blessed to use. By keeping this building, it must also be properly maintained. This, too, is stewardship. In the very near future, there are many things that need to take place to ensure our building is safe, welcoming, protected from unnecessary damage, and speaks to the glory

of God. These items include new roofing on the offices and classrooms wing, refinished stairwells (especially on the Food Pantry side), repairs to our rare and historic pipe organ, as well as a variety of other projects.

As you consider your responsibility as a steward of God's gifts, please consider how you may be able to help our faith community be a good steward of God's facility. Luther Memorial Church is able to partner with Christ in so many ministries in part because of this building.


